"Not that I have already obtained it or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus. Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Let us therefore, as many as are perfect, have this attitude; and if in anything you have a different attitude, God will reveal that also to you; however, let us keep living by that same standard to which we have attained." (Philippians 3:12-16 NASB)

Attitude is important. If you need confirmation, ask an airplane pilot what happens when attitude isn't correct. I wouldn't be surprised if it is from the world of flight that we borrow the term "attitude adjustment." The Cambridge Dictionary begins defining attitude as "a feeling or opinion about something or someone, or a way of behaving that is caused by this." Our attitude about something—anything—involves thoughts, feelings, and behavior. Whether we realize it or not, each one of us has an attitude toward the living of our Christian faith, including an attitude about church.

Observe the words of the apostle Paul. In Philippians chapter 3, Paul has been reflecting on the new life he has because of Christ's death and resurrection. In light of what Jesus has done for him, Paul determines to be satisfied with nothing less than total abandonment to his calling in Christ. This is Paul's attitude, and it is powerful. Personally, I can't read this passage without being inspired and humbled. I am inspired because I yearn to have Paul's level of commitment; I am humbled because I lack it. You may think that sounds strange coming from your pastor, but I am willing to admit it. Yes, my attitude could improve. It should be more like Paul's. Interestingly, this is exactly the invitation Paul offers to us. "Let us therefore... have this attitude" (v. 15)

If you believe your attitude could become more like that of Paul, allow me to offer a challenge. The challenge is simply this: be present in worship for the next six weeks. Consider it a "six week challenge" that can be completed before we enter the preparatory season of Lent (at which time you will receive your second challenge). If this challenge seems simplistic or inconsequential to you, remember that the first step toward success often is just showing up. Come and be present with the body of Christ at the appointed time for worship. Be engaged, expecting God to reveal Himself to you. Stand in awe of the grace you are offered through the cross of Christ. Renew yourself in God's unshakable love for you. Come, be present, and worship. See how God starts giving

you a renewed attitude of commitment to the mission of Jesus. Make it a six week start to a deeper walk with the Lord.


