Don't say you haven't been warned; Christmas is right around the corner. Three times in Revelation chapter 22 (verses 7, 12, 20) Jesus is recorded as saying "I am coming soon." It will certainly feel that way during this Advent season as we prepare for the coming of Christmas. We know the weeks will pass quickly. We also suspect that there will be disappointment if we arrive at December 25th feeling that the season has slipped away from us. With that in mind, consider a few suggestions that could help provide a sense of fulfillment during this brief season of preparation.

- Plan something by which you can serve the community. It might just be you, your family, or a group to which you belong. Non-profits often have seasonal needs that require extra volunteer help. Maybe you could talk to your Sunday School class about volunteering a day or an evening to serve an agency of your choice. This is especially helpful for children and youth as a reminder to keep focus off of self and on others.
- Rethink your approach to gift-giving. Have you ever stressed over what to get some person on your list? Remember that expressing love and thoughtfulness can take various forms. Giving a missional gift in someone's name is a worthy alternative. A relatively small gift translates into a significant blessing for families in other countries. Our friends at GFA World provide many options for impacting people living in poverty. (Go to www.gfa.org/gift/order for more information). There are many other approaches to gift-giving. Just remember that a gift doesn't have to appear under a tree or fit into a stocking.
- Make a list (and check it twice!) of fun activities you want to do during the season. Is sending Christmas cards your thing? Maybe it is a trip to see some impressive Christmas lights. It might be a night of watching your favorite Christmas movie while sipping hot cocoa. Put it on paper; declare that you want to do it! Celebrate the things that you accomplish, and make a promise to yourself that you will not stress over things that don't get done. Stress does not lead to holiday cheer!
- Keep Christ in your Christmas. You hear this year after year, and for good reason. The deep meaning and wonder of Christmas can be easily buried under busy schedules. Stay connected to your place of worship. Find a new Christmas story to read, or pick up a new Advent devotional. RightNow Media offers several good Advent-themed lessons to watch.


