Yes, they are out to get you...

... but do not be afraid. I don't want you to lose sleep, or to occupy your waking moments with worry. Still, you need to know. I want you to know. They ARE out to get you.

I believe the psalmist was on to something when he reflected in Psalm 23 on God as our shepherd. Attributed to Israel's King David, Psalm 23 is but six verses long, yet it is packed with imagery that is beautiful, meaningful and memorable. The writer describes God as one who faithfully provides for daily needs, blesses us in the sight of those who oppose us, anoints us with healing when injury comes, and fills our cup of blessing to overflowing. To end the psalm, the writer offers this reflection with the utmost of certainty: "surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life." Yes, I believe the writer was on to something powerful. When it comes to God's goodness and mercy, they ARE out to get you.

Many years ago I recall a Spirit-filled teacher pointing out that English translations of this psalm can tend to lose the power of the original language. In most of the familiar English translations, goodness and mercy is said to "follow" us. The problem is that the idea of "following" conveys an action that can be casual or passive. We might imagine the stray dog who follows you on your walk, willing to stay within a certain distance yet failing to come close. This is not a good picture of God's action toward us. Instead, picture the pet running excitedly toward his owner, anxious to welcome her home. Or better yet, picture the father in the parable of the prodigals who ran to embrace his long-lost son (see Luke 15:20). There is nothing passive in this image; it is active pursuit. This is what the psalmist describes regarding the goodness and mercy of God.

I don't know how it might impact your thoughts day by day, but to me there is something powerful in the knowledge that God is chasing those whom he loves. God desires for our eyes to behold His goodness, for His mercy to be the resting place of our hearts. If Psalm 23:6 doesn't convince you, consider also the following. "Taste and see that the Lord is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him" (Psalm 34:8). "The Lord bestows favor and honor. No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly" (Psalm 84:11). "The Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made" (Psalm 145:9). "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 106:1; 107:1; 118:1; 136:1). (cont. on pg. 2)

The psalmist knew something powerful, and wants for you to know it as well. When it comes to God's goodness and mercy, they are definitely out to get you. They WILL pursue you all the days of your life. For that reason, I encourage you to pause as often as necessary to allow God's goodness and lovingkindness to overtake you. Know in your heart and mind that the Lord is good, and savor His goodness in every day you have.


