"... let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith..." (Hebrews 12:1-2)

Anyone who has spent time playing baseball has heard these instructive words: "Keep your eye on the ball!" I often heard those words as a young boy, usually after a swing and a miss. Hitting the ball does become easier with much practice. Nevertheless, even the most experienced batters will miss the ball with regularity. If you think about it, hitting a fair ball is a remarkable feat. The ball and bat are small, and the angle at which contact is made must fall within fairly restricted parameters. For that reason, any player stepping to the plate would naturally be laser-focused on the ball about to head her/his way. With eyes fixed on the crowd, the scoreboard, or anything else, a hit is almost certain not to happen.

The writer of Hebrews exhorts the reader to keep eyes on the ball. For the Christian, the "ball" is Jesus. He IS the target. He IS the goal. Ultimately we pursue nothing other than him. Pursuit of the Kingdom is simply a corollary of pursuing the person of Jesus. The same is true of pursuit of righteousness, pursuit of spiritual fruit, pursuit of anything related to discipleship or evangelism. We will pursue all of these things—IF we are pursuing Jesus. When Jesus taught to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33), we must understand that seeking a kingdom begins with seeking a king.

It would take much space in this article to list the encumbrances we carry—not even to mention the sins that so easily entangle us. Things that cause us to come short of kingdom goals are often not bad things, but simply less than kingdom worthy in nature. Why does it sometimes feel like we "swing and miss" in church life? Probably because we don't have our eye on the ball. Comforts, preferences, worldly agendas, even traditions for tradition's sake cause us to swing hard and swing often. But if Jesus isn't the goal, it's still a miss. As the season of Lent begins, I pray that God will show us things that need to be laid aside, the grace to lay them down willingly, and the passion for pursuing Jesus with our whole hearts.

kindness we have shown them. Anything provided can be brought to the church office, and we will deliver to the school.


Shrove Tuesday
