Finding Rest

Before January 9, 2014, the greatest water challenge for people in the Kanawha Valley of West Virginia was the race against other family members for hot shower water in the mornings. When a chemical spill contaminated the water supply to over 300,000 residents, things quickly changed. People across nine counties had a new priority: access to useable water. Other priorities suddenly became secondary.

In our society we have produced answers to every need we can possibly have: pain killers for physical ailments, entertainment for mental stimulation, spas and endless products to satisfy the body, media connections (from Facebook to telephone) to satisfy social needs. Yet with all of this and much more, we still have not avoided the reality of spiritual unrest. What happens when we cannot find rest for the soul, when none of our "answers" satisfy the true longing of the heart? As with the absence of water, the longing for God takes priority over all other desires and pursuits.

The writer of Psalm 42 begins with this confession: "As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God." Like a parched tongue, the soul ultimately longs for the satisfaction of God's presence. Corrie ten Boom is credited with saying, "You will never know that Jesus is all you need until Jesus is all you have." Why is it that we often must come to times of near-crisis in order to remember what is essential in life? Must we have our possessions reduced to nothing before we realize that only Jesus is necessary for true fulfillment? Perhaps not, but it is curious how something as necessary as potable water could consistently escape our notice until we face being without it.

We are a restless generation. We resemble a person sitting on the sofa, flipping channels on the television, looking for something to watch and finding nothing. Maybe the problem is that we too easily forget—or ignore—the source of real satisfaction. Further, we lose sight of the reality that the "living water" of Christ is always near and consistently available. When our memory and mindfulness escapes us, we find ourselves living like people begging for a cup of water, all while the pump handle of the well is already in our hands.

Daylight Savings Time will begin on Sunday, March 13. Remember to set your clocks ahead so you won't be late for Sunday morning opportunities!




United Methodist Men
