Check It At the Door

What do you see when you look around the room before, during and after Sunday worship? How do you see the people? Here is a related question: how do you see yourself in that same room?

You know that I use the Wake-Up Call daily devotion as part of my spiritual journey. The entry for Thursday, June 29 is too good not to share. (You can find it at www.seedbed.com under the title "Why God Is Not Fair and Why That Is a Good Thing.") The text is from Romans 11:25-32, a passage where Paul mentions a temporary "hardening" that has come upon the Jews. If any group was a group of privilege, the Jews certainly were. Paul points out that even in their privilege, they will stand before God by the same terms as the Gentiles, the terms of God's mercy.

The Jews were not the only people inclined toward a mindset of privilege. We all are susceptible to that kind of thinking. We've been around longer than others, given more than others, and worked harder than others. Our parents did this for the church, our grandparents donated that. The list could go on and on. In all of this we forget that the way we stand in relationship with one another is predicated on how we stand in relationship with God, and no matter who we are, the only way to be in relationship with God is according to His mercy.

Perhaps we could remember these words of J.D. Walt the next time we walk into the sanctuary for worship. "Check your birthright at the door. Check your church attendance at the door. Check your good behavior at the door. Check your accomplishments and accolades and credentials and qualifications at the door. All of that might matter and have some value in some places but it has less than no value at the only door that ultimately matters. Yes, check your anything and everything else but 'Jesus Christ is Lord and God raised him from the dead,' at the door."

When you look around the room, try seeing yourself and everyone else simply as people who have checked everything at the door so we can celebrate the extravagant goodness of a merciful Savior. If it helps, remember that the ground at the foot of the cross is level. No one stands higher than another.
