Not Just What, But How

Seasons of congregational life tend to have an ebb and flow. In some seasons we feel peaceful; things roll along in a fairly normal, pleasing manner. In other seasons we feel anxious, often because uncertainty seems to hang before us. It may feel to you like Russell Memorial is in one of those anxious seasons. If so, that is quite understandable. The church conference on September 25 will soon come, and we will gather to make a decision regarding our future denominational alignment. This is no small matter. It needs to be done prayerfully, in communion with Christ and with one another.

To that end, I remind you that conversations are important right now. As we pursue them, let us be mindful of some simple biblical wisdom: "Let everyone be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger" (James 1:19b). My father used to say, "God gave us two ears and one mouth. Do you think He wants us to do more talking or listening?" Sometimes we might be more intent on making our case to others than doing the harder work of listening so we may understand their point of view. Holy conversation requires deep listening so we can know the heart-felt longings and burdens of our sisters and brothers in Christ. In the words of the "peace prayer" of St. Francis, we should not so much seek to be understood as to understand.

When conversations focus on difficult things, the way we speak has great potential to either harm or to help. Ken Sande, founder of *Relational Wisdom 360* ministry, recommends in times of conflict to question oneself on the following three levels of awareness:

- <u>*Self-awareness</u>. What's going on inside of me? What feelings am I experiencing, and why? Knowing my tendencies, how am I likely to respond? What response from me would be most helpful?
- *Other-awareness. What do others seem to be feeling? What seems to be important to them? What do they seem to need? How can I show them Christ-like love?
- *God-awareness. What might God be doing in our present situation? Where am I sensing God's presence in others or in our common life? How is God reminding me of who He is? How are my actions reflecting faith and love—or lack thereof?

Why would I bother suggesting these things? Because it points toward something I feel is crucial for any Christian congregation going through a time of discernment and decision. Many times in recent months I have said to people, "It's not just what we do; it's how we do it." Sure, we want to do the right thing (i.e. whatever is according to God's will for us). As eager as we may be to get the "what" right, we need to be equally dedicated to getting the "how" right. If we do the right thing in the wrong way, we still dishonor Christ. What is the right way? Simple: the Jesus way.


