

It's been a long time, more than seventeen years to be precise. That is how long it has been since I observed closely the travail of a mother through the birth-giving process. Watching my daughter bring her son into the world reminded me of what a holy time it is. When I say it is a holy time, I don't mean to suggest it is an easy time. Far from it. It is a time that brings anxiety, uncertainty, frustration—and a great deal of pain.

This is what makes the whole thing so interesting. Almost ironically it is all of the anxiety, the frustration—and the pain—that makes the end result so beautiful. For nine months I observed (from afar) as my daughter endured some pretty tough effects of pregnancy. For a day and a night I waited and prayed as the labor ran its course. Then on the 18th of August I received word of a gift that will forever change our lives. The travail had ended; the treasure had arrived.

With the arrival of the treasure, the mother's demeanor takes a predictable direction. I have already noticed it several times when speaking with my daughter. Whenever we talk about that new baby, she says in the most sweet, gentle voice, "He's perfect." No surprise. I wouldn't expect her to say anything else. The treasure that she holds came through great travail. It would be a great oddity for her to not regard that child with the greatest endearment. In her eyes, he is indeed perfect.

Have you considered that Jesus thinks the same about you? Consider the travail of our Lord. Hebrews 12:2 says that "for the joy set before Him (he) endured the cross, despising the shame...." The travail was unmistakable. The cruelty of the Roman cross was intensely feared, and for good reason. This is what Jesus was willing to endure. But why? For the joy set before him. The joy of what? The joy of giving birth to the Church. And if the joy of giving birth to the Church drove Jesus through such great travail, how do you think the Church looks through Jesus' eyes? Ephesians 5:27 describes the Church as being "in spender, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing... holy and

without blemish." Somehow I think if we were to ask Jesus what he thinks about the Church, he might say in the most sweet, gentle voice, "She's perfect."

You don't feel perfect, do you? Neither do I. We are keenly aware of our sins and shortcomings, or at least we should be if we are allowing the Holy Spirit to speak into our lives. Still, think about the attitude of the one who gave spiritual birth to you. If you are not yet a Christian, consider the attitude of the one who offers spiritual birth to you. He can't regard you more highly than he already does. He can't love you more deeply than he already does. You cannot be more precious to him than you already are. He has endured the greatest travail in order to make you his treasure. Embrace it and claim it.

He would want you to.
